# Clay Techniques to be Covered for this Project:

- Coil Building Technique
- Slipping and scoring
- Wedging


## Part 1: Making your Template

#### Supplies:


41/2" x 6 1/2" card stock square, pencil, ruler

1. Chose from one of the templates below:





- 2. Use a ruler to find the middle of your square. This should be around 2 ¼ inch.
- 3. Draw the midline.



- 4. Draw the template on your square of poster board
  - a. Leave at least a half inch from the top
  - b. Do not draw pass the midline
  - c. Your form should go the bottom of the square
- 5. Carefully cut out your template
- 6. PUT YOUR NAME ON IT ©

## Part 2: Building your Face Vase

#### Supplies:

• Clay, Plaster Bat, Sheet to cover your table, Lazy Susan – Turny table, Clay tools, Water, Plastic tray, Positive motivated attitude ☺

## Part 3: Attaching a Handle/s


Decide where you want to add a handle/s. Remember we are making vases that look like faces. Where could you add a handle that would enhance this concept?

- 1. Roll an even coil
- 2. Slip and score where you will be attaching your handle
- 3. Slip and score the ends of handle
- 4. Attach coil
- 5. Use your finger to smooth where handle and vase are connected.

# Part 4: Attaching a foot

Now you need to add a foot to the bottom of your vase. This step should not be done until the clay is LEATHER HARD

- 1. When the bowl is leather hard, turn it over and lightly draw a circle on the bottom. This should be drawn on the bottom at the place just after its starts to curve under.
- 2 Score and slip the circle.
- 3. Roll an even coil.
- 4. Attach a coil in a circle on the bottom. Cut the coil off when you reach the starting end of it so that the coil is a perfect circle.



5. Smooth both inside and outside attached edges, tilting the foot outward just a bit.
